A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE MATCHING DOLLARS TO A TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SITE DEVELOPMENT GRANT APPLICATION

- WHEREAS, McMinn County supports developing infrastructure to support local economic development initiatives that create new jobs and capital investment in the community; and
- WHEREAS, McMinn County has partnered with the City of Etowah and Etowah Utilities Board to acquire property to expand the North Etowah Industrial Park for future industrial growth; and
- WHEREAS, the acquired property has been certified through the Select TN Sites and CSX Select certification programs; and
- WHEREAS, McMinn County Economic Development Authority has seen strong industrial prospect activity on the acquired property over the past year; and
- WHEREAS, one of the shortfalls that has eliminated the site from consideration has been underdeveloped industrial access roads into the site; and
- WHEREAS, the time and cost to develop a new access road for direct connection to Highway 30 from the park, and the distance to the interstate has been an eliminating factor for the site; and
- WHEREAS, the McMinn County Economic Development Authority (hereinafter referred to as "Development Authority") is pursuing a Site Development Grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 through the State of Tennessee for engineering design of a new access road, right-of-way acquisition, and utility relocation; and
- WHEREAS, McMinn County understands that time-to-market is critical for new industrial plant locations and supports the Site Development Grant application; and
- WHEREAS, McMinn County understands that a ten percent (10%) local match is required for the grant, and that the Development Authority does not have the necessary funding for the match; and
- WHEREAS, the Development Authority requests that McMinn County and an Etowah municipal entity share equally in the local ten percent (10%) match of the total grant award, not to exceed \$50,000 per entity; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF McMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION THIS THE 18TH DAY OF DECEMBER 2017, that the McMinn County Commission agrees to designate up to \$50,000 from the Other Capital Projects Fund to be paid as a match on the State of Tennessee Site Development Grant, if awarded.
