WHEREAS, McMinn County will pay McMinn County E-911 for its services based on McMinn County's portion of the total dispatching cost expenses over the three year term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County's rate of dispatch will be \$556,271.01 in FY 21-22, \$584,164.90 in FY 22-23, and \$614,007.08 in FY 23-24; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Emergency Communications District has stated it is their ultimate goal to save the taxpayers money by providing quality, consolidated dispatch services; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Emergency Communications District has successfully endeavored to maintain licensed dispatchers and modern equipment; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County Commission requests the McMinn County Emergency Communications Board to annually consider prorating a rebate to its customers from any surpluses generated from increases in 911 land and cell phones fees and less than anticipated expenditures.

WHEREAS, the Redistricting Committee shall consist of the following members:

- (1) Ten current members of the McMinn County Commission voting members
- (2) County Mayor Advisory, non-voting
- (3) Administrator of Elections Advisory, non-voting
- (4) Assessor of Property GIS Staff Advisory non-voting

WHEREAS, the Redistricting Committee shall elect a chairman and its meeting shall be subject to the meetings provisions of T.C.A. Title 8, Chapter 44; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County must have an approved redistricting plan by January 1, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF McMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION THIS THE 30<sup>th</sup> DAY OF JUNE, 2021, that this Commission does hereby approve the establishment of a Redistricting Committee with said membership as presented to aid in the development of the required Redistricting Plan.
