RESOLUTION NO. 23-040

A RESOLUTION APPROVING PARTICIPATION THE STATE OF TENNESSEE'S ENERGY EFFICIENT SCHOOLS INITIATIVE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, McMinn County Schools desires to utilize the State of Tennessee's Energy Efficient Schools Initiative Program (EESI) TCA 49-17-101 to help fund the upgrade lighting systems in all of McMinn County schools, including the football stadiums and auditoriums; and

WHEREAS, the energy savings from the new LED lighting systems are guaranteed to pay back the project costs within the specified time frame; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee provides the funding for the construction while McMinn County utilizes the guaranteed savings from the school systems utilities line item to repay the funds; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Valley Authority rebate program will cover the cost of all fees, one half of one percent (.5%) associated with the EESI program, in addition to providing over \$300,000 towards the energy savings upgrades; and

WHEREAS, total cost of the project totals approximately three million, two hundred and forty-seven thousand, four hundred, sixty-three dollars (\$3,247,463) and produces a guaranteed annual energy savings of no less than four hundred, forty thousand dollars (\$440,000) with an estimated payback of seven years and four months; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission must approve the school systems participation in the program and authorizes payments to be paid to the Energy Efficient Schools Council of Tennessee.

A RESOLUTION TO CONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF PAT PATTERSON AS A JUDICIAL COMMISSIONER FOR MCMINN COUNTY

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 40-5-201 authorizes county legislative bodies to appoint judicial commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the duties of judicial commissioners are to issue arrest warrants upon a finding of probable cause, to set bonds and recognizances included in a "first appearance" before a magistrate, and to issue mittimus for persons to be held at the county jail; and

WHEREAS, the continued utilization of judicial commissioners is essential to provide due process to the citizens of McMinn County, as well as to strengthen criminal cases prepared by law enforcement of officers; and
