WHEREAS, McMinn County has committed to replace its aging pumper fleet as funds allow; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County has ordered five new pumper trucks and has elected to surplus four of the existing trucks stationed at Clearwater, Union Grove, Hillsview and Idlewild; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County desires to declare the pumper trucks as surplus property and provide them for direct sale to the respective volunteer fire departments for the following amounts:

Engine 8 Hillsview--\$19,500 Engine 7 Idlewild--\$17,000 Engine 10 Clearwater--\$19,500 Engine 9 Union Grove--\$19,000
