## RESOLUTION NO. 24-032

# A RESOLUTION TO RENEW THE CONTRACT BETWEEN McMINN COUNTY AND THE McMINN COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT FOR EMERGENCY DISPATCH SERVICES

WHEREAS, in February, 2003, the McMinn County Board of Commissioners approved the consolidation of McMinn County Emergency dispatch to be placed under the management of the McMinn County E-911 Center; and

WHEREAS, the current three year contract expires in June 2024; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County and the McMinn County Emergency Communications District desire to renew the contract for an additional three year term until June 30, 2027; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County E-911 is increasing the dispatcher salary line item of its budget to help mitigate the issue of losing experienced, high-quality dispatchers; and

WHEREAS, these salary increases also require the users of the E-911 system to increase their contributions; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County will pay McMinn County E-911 for its services based on McMinn County's portion of the total dispatching cost expenses over the three year term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County's rate of dispatch will be \$762,830 in FY 24-25, \$793,026 in FY 25-26, and \$824,348 in FY 26-27; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Emergency Communications District has stated it is their ultimate goal to save the taxpayers money by providing quality, consolidated dispatch services; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Emergency Communications District has successfully endeavored to maintain licensed dispatchers and modern equipment; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County Commission requests the McMinn County Emergency Communications Board to annually consider prorating a rebate to its customers from any surpluses generated from increases in 911 land and cell phones fees and less than anticipated expenditures.
