WHEREAS, the IDB will employ a Tennessee licensed contractor to renovate the property to McMinn County specifications for use as the new McMinn County Courthouse Annex, and transfer the facility to McMinn County upon receiving a certificate of occupancy; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County will advance the funds from the Capital Outlay Fund to the IDB, which will be replaced with funds generated from the sale of 5 South Hill Street property at closing; and

WHEREAS, the county mayor and county attorney are authorized to execute an agreement with the McMinn County Industrial Bond Board and its counsel to satisfy the intent of this resolution that shall be in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee governing the operations of industrial bond boards.
